of 6.49673 and longitude of 6.3700 and it has elevation of 155 meters above sea level, her

neighboring towns includes, Ewohimi, Okhue- Esan, Ohordua, Udo- Neria. The predominant

languages Spoken by the people are Esan and English Languages. Their major Occupation are

farming, Hunting, Trading, Traditional Medicine practicing, teaching, Craftsman, Health work,

and so on Majority of the people in Ewatto are farmer and their major farm products are:
